



Birthdays

We celebrate birthdays during the snack period. We ask that the mothers send or bring a snack and drink to make this a special time for your child. Your child's preschool teacher will schedule this event on the monthly newsletter.

Toys

Toys get lost and broken at school -- so please do not let your child bring toys to school except on show and tell days, toy days, or special occasions that will be listed on your child's newsletter.

*If your child has some special toy or pet he would like to show the class, just notify the teacher ahead of time.

Health Policy

All students must have a completed medical form signed by a physician or the public health nurse. Students must be current with the state's immunization schedule. We want to maintain the best possible health environment for all the students so please....

Keep your child home if he has the following:

Abnormal rash, itching or swelling

Constant cough or sore throat

Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea

Questionable eye redness, drainage or inability to open eyelids upon awakening

Runny nose due to infection. (To distinguish between allergy and infection, the latter is usually thick and colored.)

Symptoms of a possible communicable disease. (These are sniffles, red eyes, sore throat, headache, abdominal pain, plus a fever.) Please notify the school at once if your child does have a communicable disease. If your child is on medication, please make sure it has time to start working before your child returns to school.

Your child may come to school:

If his cold is over, but he is left with a minor nasal drip.

If he has been exposed to a communicable disease, but the school has been notified so that the incubation period can be discussed and it can be determined on what dates he should stay home.

The preschool desires to provide conditions that encourage cleanliness and good health practices among the children. A child becoming ill after arrival at school will be placed in an isolation room and his parents will be notified as soon as possible.

Discipline
